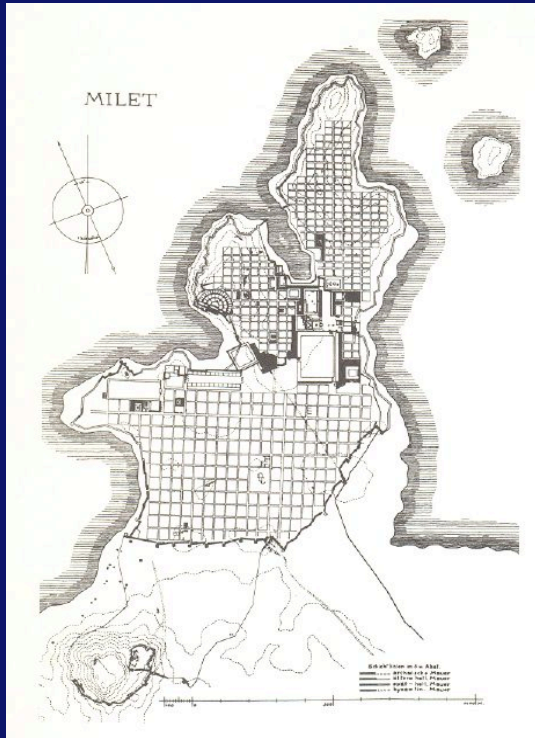

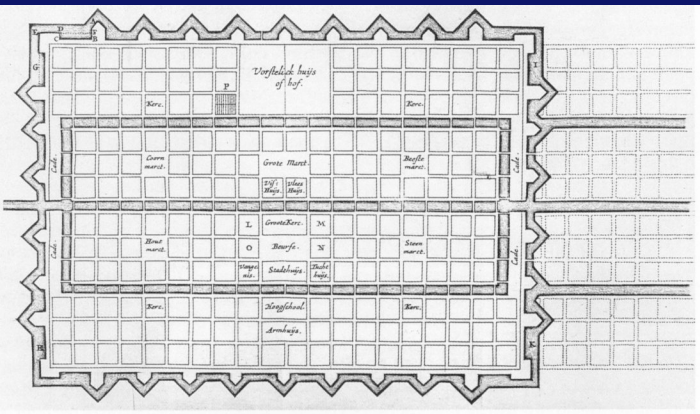

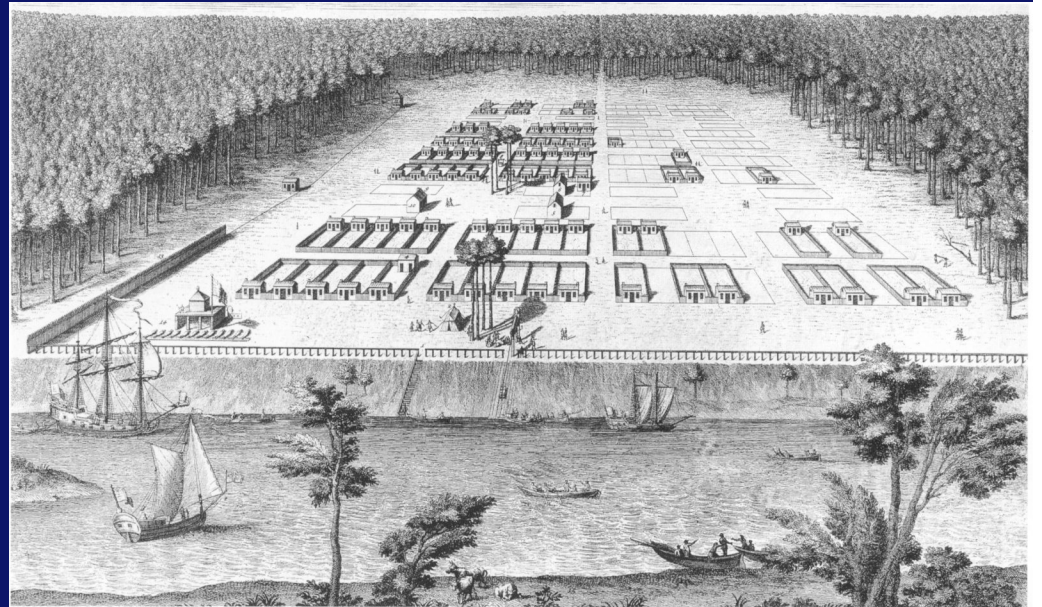
Miletus, 5th c. BC

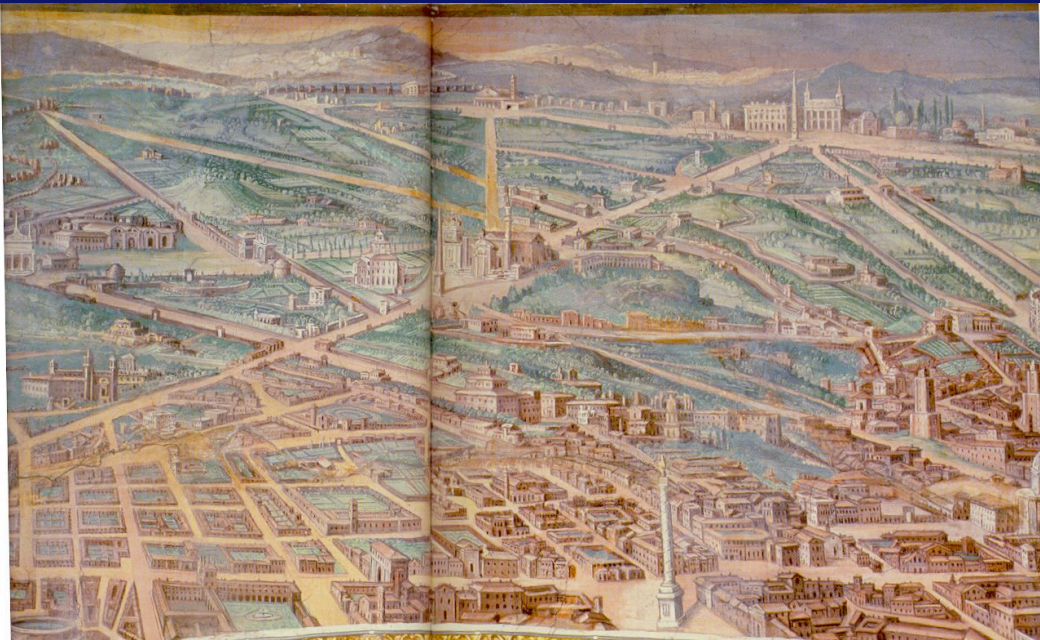

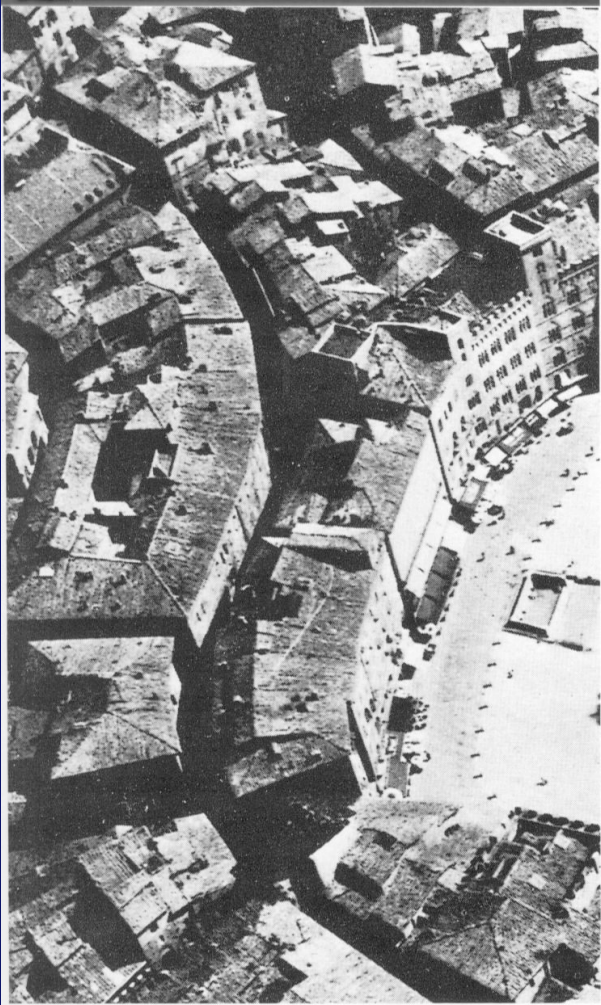


L'Enfant's Plan of Washington, 1791

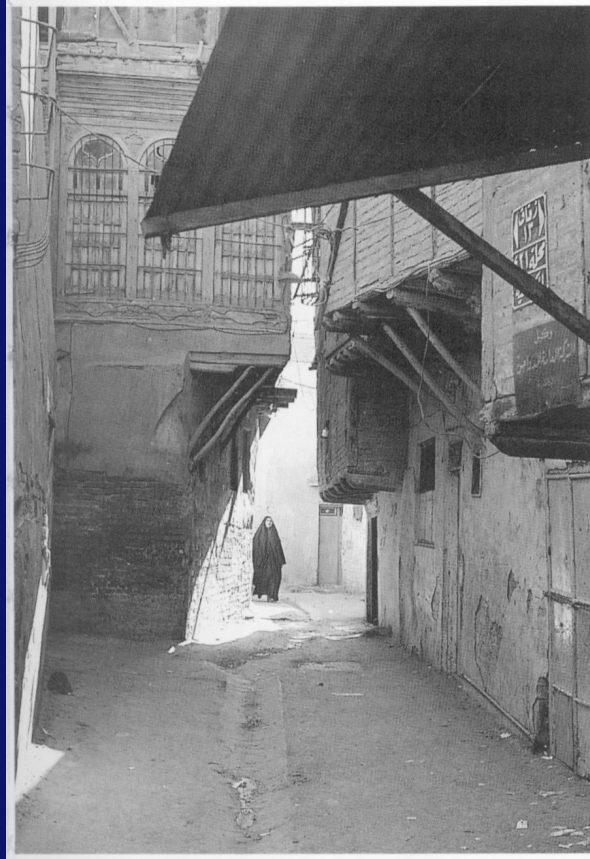


Replanning of Rome, 1585-90, Pope Sixtus V

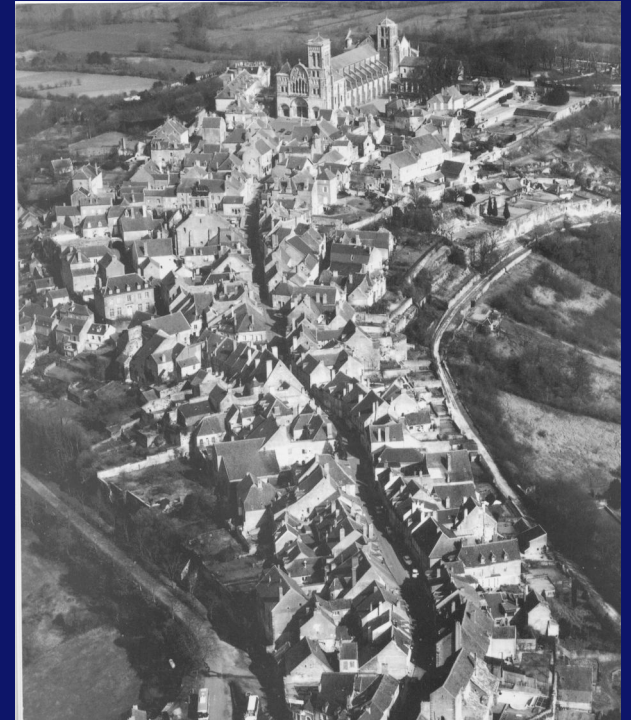

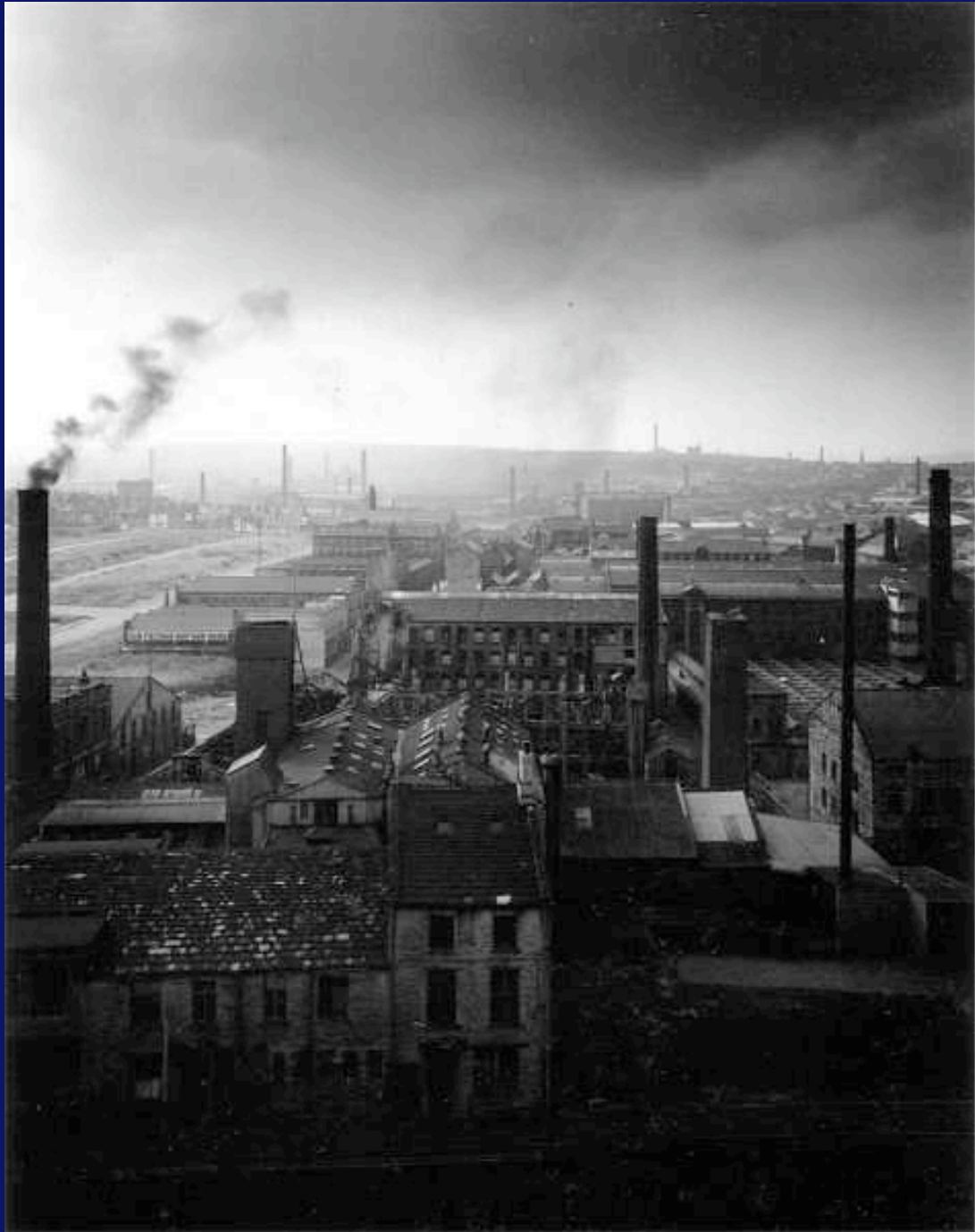

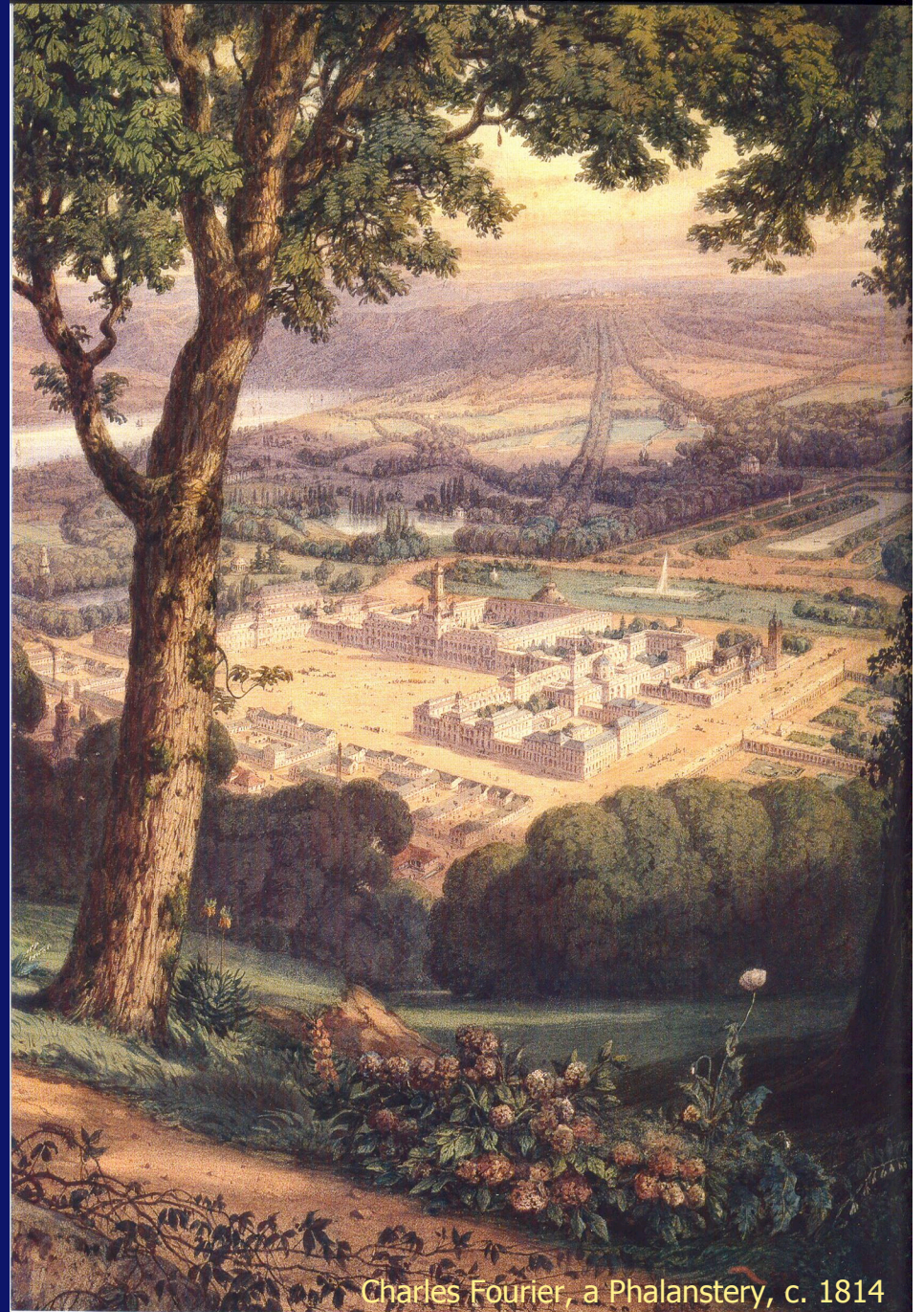




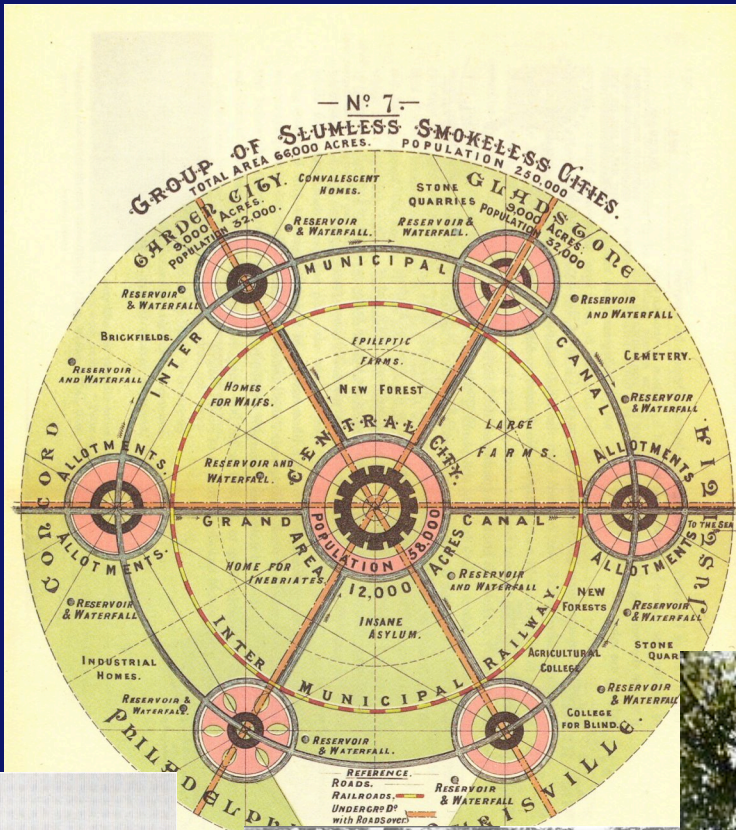
Robert Owen, "Project for a Village of Cooperation", 1816

Charles Fourier, a Phalanstery, c. 1814

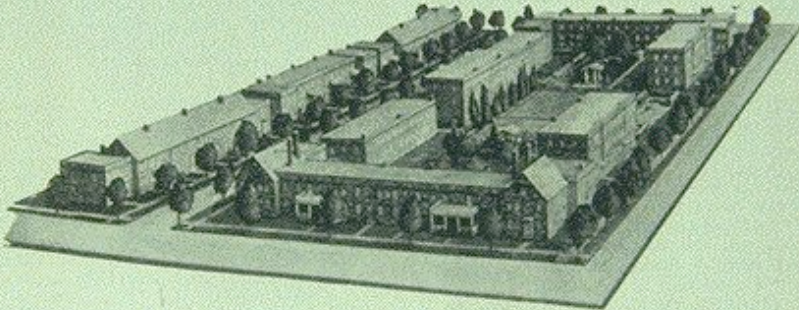

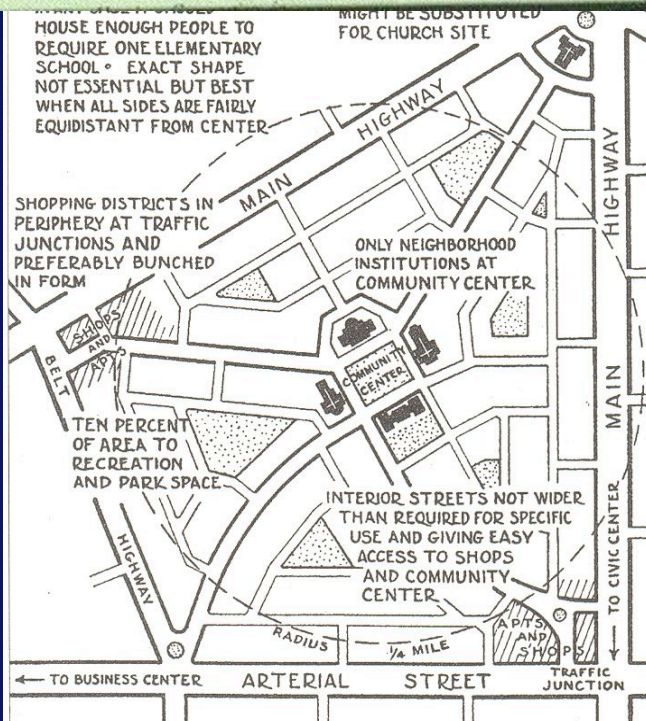
