#### ALTERNATIVE 3 - ELEVATED/MIAMI AVENUE



## Pros



- · Continuity of urban grid
- Versatile useable space below highway
- Vehicular & pedestrian views to the city
- Architectural and structural possibilities
- Potential to reconnect local streets



- Ramps create zones of unusable space
- · If low elevation -can be a visual barrier
- Requires R/W

Cost: \$580 million

#### ALTERNATIVE 5 - OPEN-CUT

#### Pros

- Safe pedestrian and vehicular crossings at select locations
- Reduced noise levels
- · Highway less visible from distance
- Open space opportunity on existing highway property



#### Cons

- Cut / Severs Overtown
- · Vehicular views to city blocked
- Crossings limited to street locations
- Potential flooding issues / evacuation route
- Conflicts with existing underground utilities
- Excavate contaminated soil
- Construction Related Impacts
- Requires more R/W than Tunnel Option







### ALTERNATIVE 4 - TUNNEL

#### Pros

- · Safe pedestrian and vehicular crossings
- · Reduced noise levels
- · Highway becomes hidden
- · Opportunity to utilize area above highway

#### Cons

- Potential to disconnect local streets
- · Potential flooding issues / evacuation route
- · Conflicts with existing underground utilities
- · Excavate contaminated soil
- · No vehicular views to city
- · Most expensive alternative
- Construction related Impacts
- Complex MOT Required
- Requires more R/W than elevated Option

Cost: over \$1 billion





Option for super elevated "split" facility




# FDOT Created four alternatives:


- Do Nothing (not a bad idea)

- A Tunnel


